

## COVID-19 SAFETY PLAN - SNAPSHOT

### MEASURES WE'RE TAKING

In order to ensure that all club members and contractors know how to keep themselves safe from exposure to COVID-19, the Board of Directors has developed the following measures.

The contract cleaner, bar coordinator and ice technician have been provided with Health Canada approved cleaning products for the disinfecting of high touch surfaces. Members are provided with approved hand sanitizer and products for cleaning curling stones.

All club members have been instructed to maintain at least 2 metres from each other at all times in the lounge, including the line-up for the bar, and follow on-ice game flow procedures to maintain social distancing.

Face masks are mandatory in all areas of the club, except when seated to consume food or drink, and on the ice during the playing of a game. The wearing of masks while on the ice has been strongly encouraged by the Board of Directors.

### How we're screening for COVID-19:

Members and contractors are required to self-assess themselves on the following points before entering the curling facility:

1. Do you have any of the following new or worsening symptoms or signs? Note: symptoms should not include chronic or related to other known causes or conditions.

- Fever or Chills
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Cough
- Runny nose/stuffy nose or nasal congestion
- Decrease or loss of smell or taste

- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain
- Not feeling well, extreme tiredness, sore muscles

2. Have you had close contact with a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19?

All persons that have not completed a self-assessment, or failed the self-assessment (i.e., answered “yes” to any of the above questions), will be required to leave the building, and further will be advised to contact the Public Health Unit.

### **How we’re controlling the risk of transmission in our curling facility:**

Physical distancing and separation:

- The maximum number of people allowed in the club at any time is limited to 50, in order to meet physical distancing requirements.
- Physical distancing in all areas of the club and on the ice are required. On-ice game play movement flow patterns have been established, with illustrations and signs to aid this effort.

Cleaning:

- Cleaning will be performed and scheduled regularly. All high touch surfaces will be disinfected using Health Canada approved disinfectant after every league play and after ice maintenance. All surfaces are properly disinfected, in order to minimize risk of transmission.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- Masks must be worn by all members and contractors. Additional PPE is available if needed (e.g., gloves).

### **What we will do if there is a potential case, or suspected exposure to, COVID-19 at our curling facility?**

The Haliburton Kawartha Pine Ridge Public Health Unit will be contacted immediately for instruction on how to deal with the risk of possible spread.

In addition, the club would be closed for at least 1 day to allow for an extensive deep cleaning. All members will be notified by email.

**How we're managing any new risks caused by the changes made to the way we operate our facility?**

Changes to the facility protocols made to prevent COVID-19 transmission pose no risks to the members. Should any new risks be identified, they will be promptly reviewed and addressed by the Board of Directors.

**How we're making sure our plan is working?**

Our plan is working when members demonstrate that they are following the protocols provided by the Board, in accordance with government and health unit COVID-19 prevention regulations. A 2-metre distance requirement must be maintained at all times, even when wearing a mask. This is the core of our safety plan. When all members consistently follow these requirements, it demonstrates that the plan is working.

The Board will ensure that regular scheduled cleaning is being followed and to a sufficient thoroughness. Ensuring proper cleaning techniques to maximize hygiene demonstrates that our plan to minimize the risk of transmission as much as possible is working.

The mandatory mask policy further contributes to our COVID-19 prevention and safety plan by ensuring members and contractors are protected in all situations on our premises.

Ultimately, our goal is to ensure that no individual infected with COVID-19 enters our facility.

As such, we require that all members and contractors self-assess themselves before entering our club and that they stay home and contact public health if they have any symptoms related to COVID-19 or have a possible risk of exposure.

Our plan is working when there is minimal risk of COVID-19 transmission to our membership, although we are fully prepared to contact and cooperate with the public health unit in the event that there is. Our plan helps to ensure the safety of our members and the community as a whole.
